
## Island Update - Malcolm

Sointula Resource Centre Society

### Malcolm Island-Sointula

- An intentional community founded in 1901 by a group of socialist Finns attempting to create a utopian society.
- Sointula Co-op Store operating since 1909. (Food, gas, hardware)
- Full time residents 744 (2016)
- Manages its own drinking water through the Sointula Waterworks.
- 23% of properties in the Waterworks District (Town) are owned by people from off island.



## **COVID Community Response**

#### **Malcolm Island Pandemic Supporters**

- Created mass mail out to inform community of supports and protocols
- Created a community kitchen to support anyone with Covid
- Organized a free mask program
- Established a list of accommodations for people to self isolate
- A 60 person volunteer list to delivery groceries, walk pets, gather mail, pick up medication and check in on folks
- Almost everyone in the local phone book was called for general check in and to make sure they knew about supports systems in place




## Sointula Resource Centre Society

- Created a Covid web page with all local essential businesses and services hours and protocols, links to provincial, federal, and health support programs.
- Developed protocols early to keep community access computers available and provided support for online applications. (installed screen sharing software so people could physically distance)
- Supported local volunteer groups.
- Information, information, information (website, social media and good old fashioned posters)



## Pandemic Planning Group


- Composed of community leaders from the island including: the SRC, MIPS, Volunteer Fire Dept, Health Nurse, Paramedics, the Sointula Recreation Association, Malcolm Island Harbour Authority, the Regional District of Mount Waddington, Seniors and a couple of highly active community members at large.
- Came to be once it was discovered our Emergency Response Plan only dealt with hurricanes and tsunamis.
- Created short term strategies to support community.
- Currently developing an action plan for emergency response based on lesson learned and to be prepared for future.



## **Current Challenges**

#### Reopening

- There is division in community on how, if, and when to reopen to non-residents.
- Conflicting messages between the Province's reopening plan and BC Ferries non-essential travel recommendation.
- o General confusion on what's next.
- What to tell visitors about bringing in supplies?
- Supporting our Co-op.









# Economic Response & Recovery Survey – Salt Spring Island • April 2020


The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce and Salt Spring Island Community Economic Development Commission on behalf of the Farm and Business Response and Recovery Task Force conducted a business impact survey to evaluate the impact the COVID-19 crisis is having on Salt Spring Businesses.

There were 96 respondents of approximately 700 local businesses. The respondents represented a variety of industries and a variety of home-based vs. commercial businesses.

#### Here are some of the key findings:







#### 4. If applicable, how many employees have you released as a result of the pandemic.


A stated total of 269 employees from the 96 surveyed businesses.










### 6. If 'social distancing' becomes the new norm, will your business be able to accommodate while remaining









#### 8. What do you anticipate as your main challenges in the next 2-3 months?

- Cash Flow: 74% of respondents indicated cash-flow as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months.
- **Demand:** 47.9% of respondents indicated demand as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months. .
- Supply Chain: 26% of respondents indicated supply chain as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months.
- **Rent/Landlord Negotiations:** 22.9% of respondents indicated rent/landlord negotiations as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months.
- **Repayment of Existing Loans:** 19.8% of respondents indicated repayment of existing loans as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months.
- Morale: 18.8% of respondents indicated morale as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months.
- Staffing: 18.8% of respondents indicated staffing as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months.
- **Bankruptcy:** 11% of respondents indicated bankruptcy as one of their top 3 challenges in the next 2-3 months.

Indicated in comments, many businesses commented on the decline in tourism and concern that the season will not pick up or recover due to the virus as being a big concern (demand). As well as concern over ferries, the elimination of the Long Harbour/Tswwassen route until June for business purposes (Supply chain).






Many comments indicated a heavy reliance on tourism or blended industries, specific types of retail including social enterprises.


11. Would you be interested in having a local investor invest in your business to keep it operations and locally owned?

In the additional comments sections businesses revealed details about their concern for not only this year, but for up to 30 months due to the loss of the tourism season and people's desire to plan closer to home experiences and life events for next year.

Additionally, many businesses stated that bridging from the government and community will not be enough unless there is ongoing support through the winter and into the next "high season". Typically high season profits cover low season losses.

Charitable organizations stated concerns over loss revenue due to cancelled events as a serious concern.

There were a variety of comments from businesses that do not qualify for the government subsidies in any form as they are either too small or have blended incomes (Retirement being a major one).
